We hold public meetings 4 times a year, this gives local people the chance to have their say on health & social care services in Telford & Wrekin.

Our next Public Meeting will be held in February 2020, more information will be found on our website in the new year.

What is an Enter and View?

An Enter and View is a statutory power that Healthwatch Telford and Wrekin has that allows us to visit any publicly funded health and social care premises.

During a visit, our highly trained Authorised Representatives will be able to see for themselves how services are being provided, and they will talk to the service users, carers and relatives about what they think.

After the visit, a report will be written that summarises their findings and any recommendations they have.

It is important to note that Enter and Visit is an engagement tool, not an inspection.

This gives us an overview of how people feel about the service they or their loved ones are receiving.

Baby Buddy

The Shropshire, Telford and Wrekin local maternity system (LMS) have teamed up with the national charity Best Beginnings to launch the free mobile app 'Baby Buddy'.

The app offers support to parents during pregnancy and the first months of a baby's life and is a valuable resource for expectant parents, new parents and professionals,



Baby Buddy is your personal baby expert who will guide you through your pregnancy and the first six months of your baby's life.

which has been accredited by the NHS.

The app is available for people within Shropshire, Telford and Wrekin to ensure women and their families have local information and support.

Healthy Hearts

Telford Healthy Hearts campaign aims to reduce the risk of people having a stroke and heart attack. This campaign is

based on Bradford's work where GPs remotely reviewed patients and identified those at risk. GPs sent letters out to



advise people of medication changes. People can also advise about where to get lifestyle advice and information on conditions.

NHS Winter Pressures campaign #HelpUsHelpYou

If you have an urgent but non-threatening medical concern, to find out what to do and where to go you can access NHS 111. Instead of worrying or self-diagnosing this campaign encourages people to call 111 or visit 111.nhs.uk online.

You can also access information via the new NHS App, which is available across England.

The 'Help Us, Help You' campaign aims to increase peoples' understanding of the actions they can take to help the NHS to help them, with this phase focusing specifically on when to use NHS 111.

This is a free service available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Live Well Telford provides information and signposting to a

wide range of services, activities and organisations in the area, to help everyone find the support they need to live healthy independent lives.



With advice or practical support, help at home, health conditions, childcare information, leisure information and much more.

NHS Long-term Plan

The Government is investing an extra £20bn a year in the NHS until 2023.

The NHS has produced a Long-term Plan, setting out all the things it wants health services to do better for people across the country. For these plans to work, the NHS needs to shape local plans based on local needs.

We asked people What Would You Do to improve local services in Shropshire. We heard from over 640 people about what they wanted from local services.

Would you do? It's your NHS. Have your say.

The top priorities include:

- easier access to treatment and services
- help with making lifestyle choices
- better information about support available
- improved communication around prevention
- more training for healthcare staff on conditions such as mental health



Here at your local Healthwatch, our volunteers are at the heart of what we do!

Currently we have 28 active volunteers (5 of which recently joined us) who support the work we do. This ranges from office admin tasks to engaging with the wider community where we listen to your views and experiences about Health and Social Care Services in Telford & Wrekin.

Buddy System:

Katie Cook, our Engagement Officer, has recently launched a new Buddy System; the purpose of which is for all volunteers to have a point of contact who they can go to for structured support and guidance.
